Understanding the Map of Hamilton Town

Map references e.g. (630 560) are taken from ordnance survey grids, and are a means to locate the general area of a farm, which may include farm houses, barns, fields and forest plantations. In Hamilton a more detailed survey relates to individual streets and buildings.

Brief History of Castles and Palace

The town originated as the village of Netherton (72695 56619), located near to the Clyde, bordering the M8 motorway and Hamilton Low parks. Hamilton Castle (ordnance survey map reference 725 560) was developed from about 1315 when Cadzow Castle (7347 5376) was granted to the Hamilton family by Robert the Bruce. In 1591 the first Hamilton Castle was in occupation.

Subsequent development led to removal of almost all of the original castle and the replacement was called the Palace from about 1660. The Palace is clearly located on maps at the apex of street lines radiating away from the main Gateway and towards the Old Cross area. Most of this has been built over with surviving streets linked to New Cross.

At this time, the Palace appeared as an open U with the north side left open. The construction of the Palace was completed by a 4th range, in 1822 to 1830, facing north, to the line of hills now occupied by High Rise Towers in Motherwell. A small-scale exhibition was developed to show the construction of the north facing side; with quarries traced to Bothwell Bridge and to Dal serf, on the River Clyde.

The front entrance was decorated with twelve columns, of single blocks, quarried in Dal serf; and hauled by a large horse-drawn cart eight miles to the Palace site. the stone columns were over 30 feet long, weighting 30 tons each, and required thirty Clydesdale horses to haul the cart, containing a single piece of stone

Brief History of Castles and Palace (continued)

Local bands accompanied each cart load, and the stone was then sculpted, by a graith, a horse-powered stone cutting machine. The entire process of quarrying, carting and cutting the columns lasted about one year.

The Palace was occupied fully completed, from about 1830 to 1880s, when auctions took place to sell the extensive art, furniture, library (of seven thousand books) and even entire room walls were sold off. The palace was undermined by coal mining and eventually, vacant and demolished during the 1920s. The location is occupied by sports halls today, as agreed when selling the Palace land to the local authority.

The town of Hamilton developed, initially to support Hamilton Castle and later, Hamilton Palace, and the cover to this booklet is a drawing by Selzer published as part of Theatre Scotiae, dated 1693. See National Library of Scotland, Special Collections Reading Room: stored in George IV Bridge.

The stables, built in the mid 1820s are now the town museum on Muir Street at Palace Grounds road. After the extension of the Palace in 1822 to 1830, the estate became further subject to financial distress in addition to the impact of Dukes' horse -race gambling and the purchase of high-value art works for the Palace.

Although the main developments of Hamilton Town were originally in support of the Palace, by 1900, the Town Council and commercial interests, had outstripped control by the Hamilton estate. This was also affected by the First World war, changes in taxation of estates and the impact of declining coal operations as the coal available was worked out.

Appendix 2

Coal, Mining and Railway lines.

In 1850, a survey of the entire Lanarkshire estate was undertaken, to identify locations which could support commercial levels of coal-mining, with rents for farming on the surface continuing particularly in the areas south of the river Clyde, now South Lanarkshire. North of the Clyde, open cast methods were adopted, leading to loss of farming land on a permanent basis, combined with intensive construction of large iron and steel facilities, railway and factory premises, and related, densely- packed housing in the Motherwell areas.

Large Houses at Autoincrement, Udstone, Eddlewood and Warnock became surrounded by housing and mining operations. Modern housing estates occupy the land within the Barony, to the south of the original town limits. The rail lines were concentrated in the Peacock Cross area, bringing the loop line from Blantyre and Quarter to meet the main line to Glasgow .

The original railway station was on Autoincrement road; now occupied by a school. Peacock cross was a major interchange of rail lines and the Bus station today occupies the site of the major coal yards next to Hamilton Central station, (originally Caledonian Railway). Parts of the original main entrance can be seen on Quarry street, at the east end of the station. The original station for Hamilton was on Autoincrement Road, near to the Central Library, and buildings at Peacock Cross appear to include partial remains of the Caledonian Railway Hotel (714 556). Some surviving traces of the railway, constructed to haul coal from Strathaven and Larkhall, to Hamilton can be seen in Idlewood area and at Peacock Cross. A railway line was backfilled to about 50 feet deep, leading towards the town centre.

Appendix 3

Palace extensions and impact on the town

The Palace developed in scale and progressively took over land occupied by houses, tenements, and trades, to create a designed garden, surrounding the Palace, and enclosed by a high wall with five gatehouses. The Walls ran from Bothwell Bridge to the town centre at Old Cross area and down to the Clyde.

A Horse and carriage way was constructed from the Palace gateway, (near to the roundabout leading to Motherwell and the M8 motorway) about two miles to Chatelerault, the Hunting Lodge and dog kennels for the Dukes. Chatelerault (73644 53930) is open to the public, and offers access to Cadzow Castle, the Avon gorge and wooded hillsides. A coal mine was set up on the Avon, at 'Hoole Raw' along the north bank of the Avon. Although many mining operations surrounded the Palace grounds, This was the only coal mine within the Palace and Chatelerault grounds,

It seems clear that although the Dukes owned the land in the town area, individual buildings may have been constructed by other people, e.g. Cameron, Mack, Austin, Shaw. By 1917, annual rents of individual rooms were being reported as total cash incomes, rather than being reported individually by the Factor to the Estate, at that time, managed by trustees rather than directly by the Duke in Person.

Part of the town appeared to be owned by Aikman of Ross, on which the Duke paid feu duty to Aikman, and that family, based at Ross House on the south of the Clyde, (opposite Airbles)(737 555), on Hamilton Haugh also paid rents and feus to the Dukes Estate on other premises and land. Ferniegair (73322 54637) (near the Old Avon bridge and Chatelherault), Castle Street (In Hamilton Town), Haughhead, and Whitehill (71225 57037) near to the industrial estate on Bothwell road. Now a large housing estate, at that time, this area was extensively mined with coal and quarry operations.

In 1914, The legal position of entailed estates came to an end, and in 1918 the Private Act for the Hamilton estates allowed the sale of the lands. Arran was retained separately from the Lanarkshire estates as was Boness and Kinneil House, on the River Forth.


